But a gifted or talented identification might suffice.Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and TechnologyFor any kid looking to excel in a STEM field, there's really no better high school in America, reports The Best Schools site. Located in the eco-friendly city of Alexandria, Virginia, TJHSST covers a variety of topics, including artificial intelligence, quantum mechanics and marine biology. Application requirements include an entrance exam, essay, recommendations and a history of academic achievement.
